

- **The written paper has two parts Paper I of 250 marks is a test of general awareness, basic intelligence and reasoning and numerical ability. Paper II of 150 marks is an assessment of ability to read and understand serious discursive prose and also the ability to express the ideas clearly and correctly. This comprises essay (in Hindi or English), precis writing and comprehension of a given passage, (in English only).
- ***Physical efficiency test This is a test to ensure physical fitness. It comprises of 100 meters (16 sec), 800 meters races (3 miin), long jump 3.5 meters men, high jump 1.05 meters men, shot-put (4.50 meters, 7.26 Kgs). Three chances are given for long and high jump.
- *****Interview Beginning with questions pertaining to the bio data, the interviewers move on to hobbies, subjects of study, general awareness and general intelligence. The candidates psyche, aptitude, mannerisms and etiquette along with the dedication to the cause of the nation are also assessed by the Board.

- Journalism is the business of giving news. Journalists work for newspapers, magazines, regional dailies, the electronic medium, websites and for government & public sector publications. The print medium holds an important role in our lives, providing the latest news and acting as a forum for addressing public issues and grievances.

- Newspaper journalism
- Newspaper work is broadly divided into two streams: the field and the desk.

Field work:

- Journalists are assigned to cover political issues, law and order, sports, education, local affairs and the like. Journalists may be assigned to specific 'beats' to cover all happenings in that area.
- They cover news stories, national and local events to inform its readers what is happening where, why and how.
- The main job entails witnessing events and reporting in a style which influences people to react to the changing scene.

The local reporter, the national affairs correspondent, the foreign correspondent, sports, travel and other specialist writers all go outside the office to collect information and file news reports.

Desk work:

- This is an office job. Sub-editors or copy editors process these 'stories' for presentation with headlines.
- They are responsible to see that the 'story' is objective and has no personal bias.
- Reporting and subbing are complementary and are vital functions in the editorial department.

In the newspaper office:

 The team in a newspaper office is headed by the editor under him there are sub-editors, correspondents, special reporters, reporters and freelance journalists, photojournalists etc.

Editors:

- Plan the contents of the publication and supervise its preparation.
- Administrative duties of editors include hiring writers, planning budgets, negotiating contracts with freelance writers, etc.

Associate or assistant editors:

• Have responsibility for particular subjects, such as sports, international news, education, careers, family, etc.

Sub-editors:

• Give final shape to the story submitted by a reporter.

• Acts almost like a 'gate keeper' editing, reformatting and objectively presenting each report keeping in mind the general policy of the newspaper.

Reporters and correspondents:

- Prepare stories about local, state, national and international events.
- Present varied viewpoints on current issues.
- Monitor the actions of public officials and others who exercise power through their columns.

Correspondents:

• Are based in large cities and in other countries to prepare stories on major news events occurring in these locations.

Freelance journalists:

• Write independently and get paid for each piece or article they write.

Columnist:

- Are appointed by newspapers & periodicals as specialists for regular columns.
- Contribute to the column on a regular basis for which they receive a fixed amount.

Commentators:

 Eminent personalities, an authority in a field, are invited by the newspapers & periodicals to write on topical issues or leading articles on a selected subject.

Magazine journalism:

The structure in magazine publishing is almost the same as that of a newspaper. There is the editor, associate editors and journalists who write specific stories assigned to them.

- The work involves researching, interviewing and stimulating writing.
- There are freelance contributions, columnists and special commentators involved even in magazine journalism.

Other people in the profession

Cartoonist:

- Prepares comical or satirical sketch on political, cultural events
- While established cartoonists are working for some big groups, others are generally free lancers.

Artists:

• Illustrators and cartographers specialize in maps and charts to illustrate data work in this medium.

Photojournalist:

Provides photographs which cover or tell a story or illustrating an event.

CAREER AS PROTECTIVE SERVICES PERSONNEL

- The Protective services are responsible for defending and preserving the security of the country. They are also responsible for helping in the event of civil unrest or natural disasters. Protective services include the Armed Forces Army, Navy, Air Force and the Paramilitary Forces. Paramilitary forces are organizations which maintain internal law and order, guard our frontiers, enforce excise and custom regulations and ensure security for people and property. These are the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), the Border Security Force (BSF), the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP), the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), Coast Guards, State Police Forces and Home guards, Railway Protection Forces, Fire Services.

<u>Army</u>

Consists of armed personnel (troops), their equipment, weapons and military bases. The Army is made up of regiments and corps, each of which has a specific military function

<u>Navy</u>

Consists of a nation's combat fleet, its supporting ships, their personnel, the training establishments and the land bases. Warships as aircraft carriers, cruisers, destroyers, frigates and submarines operate in deep seas. Support ships, also known as auxiliary ships, provide them with fuel, rations, armament repair facilities and various other services.

THE INDIAN AIR FORCE

- Guards the country's sky against external aggression from air and with active participation of Army and Navy it supplements and complements their defense and offence endeavors.
- CRPF (Central Reserve Police Force) is responsible for maintenance of internal security and enforcement of law and order. CRPF often assists and supports other protective agencies.
- During floods, riots and terrorist activities CRPF personnel provide relief and rescue services.

Border Security Force (BSF)

Has the task of keeping vigil on our borders which have mountainous terrains, deserts and long coastal stretches

Border Road organization

Carries out construction and development works comprising air fields building projects, cantonments, defense works etc. BRO is popularly known as General Reserve Engineer Force and it commenced its work with Army Engineer Groups

Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP)

Patrol the Himalayan ranges which border India and China as well as to provide security to sensitive installations, banks etc

Central Industrial Security Force (CISF)

Is responsible for providing security to industrial establishments.

Territorial Army

Carries out operational tasks, internal security duties and assists civil authorities

Home Guard

Serve as a standby force during emergencies and to assist in maintaining law and order, manage traffic in cities

Fire Brigade Force

Are stationed at all towns/cities/public sector industrial townships, airports, ports etc.

Every State appoints and maintains a Police Force for prevention of crime, maintenance and enforcement of law and order in the State



Career in Clinical Psychology: Eligibility

To begin a career in clinical psychology, aspirants must pursue a degree from a university. Candidates will need to be eligible for pursuing a course. The criteria vary from course to course. Check below the eligibility criteria of clinical psychology in India-

- 1. For UG courses, the aspirants must have passed 10+2 with a minimum of 50% aggregate.
- 2. Candidates who have passed a bachelor's degree can pursue a master's degree from a recognized institute.
- 3. For a PhD, the master's is a compulsory requirement.
- 4. Candidates could be from any stream, i.e. arts, science or commerce.

Career in Clinical Psychology: Specialisation

- Forensic Psychology Forensic psychology combines forensics and psychology together to address legal matters, applying the scientific principles and practices of psychology to resolve legal issues. Several forensic psychologists work as practised witnesses in court cases involving criminal insanity pleas, child custody, and discrimination issues.
- Clinical Child Psychology Clinical child psychology involves assessing, diagnosing and treating adolescents, children, toddlers and infants. The speciality is based on a strong understanding of developmental psychology and the younger generation's biological, psychological, and social problems.
- Health Psychology This speciality addresses how mental health can affect a person's physical health. The professional creates a treatment plan focused on health and well-being is significant for the client to adopt a healthier, more positive lifestyle.
- Clinical Neuropsychology Clinical neuropsychology is the speciality of clinical psychology that is based on the relationship between the brain and behaviour. Clinical neuropsychologists often assist clients with traumatic brain injuries, tumours, dementia and other problems regarding cognitive functioning.

- Geropsychology Geropsychology is the speciality of clinical psychology concerned with treating the elderly and their families and helping them cope with end-of-life decisions, loss of independence and self-care.
- 6. Sports Psychology Sports psychology deals with the top performance and well-being of athletes and sportspersons. Psychologists can make a huge difference in an athlete's performance by treating his/her cognitive, emotional, and physiological health.
